REPORT ON ACTIVITIES JANUARY-JUNE 2025

FOSTER BUSINESS GROWTH

- Connected with over 130 local companies and businesses to provide outreach and support.
- Continuing to work with a local childcare team to provide start-up assistance for home-based and center based childcare businesses as well as assisting in the expansion of CLK's childcare center.
- Processed one loan and three industrial facilities tax exemptions for expanding local manufacturers.
- Referred multiple businesses to Michigan Works and the SBDC.

IMPROVE INFRASTRUCTURE -

Advocated for improved broadband infrastructure.

REVITALIZE OUR COMMUNITIES

- Supporting 12 commercial, mixed-use, and residential development projects, totaling an estimated \$49.1 million in investment and at least 107 residential units.
- Continuing to work on the Ruppe Building stabilization effort through fundraising, securing agreements, organizing volunteer clean-ups, and overseeing work progress.
- Managing multiple rounds of Blight Elimination funding for demolition and stabilization of properties in the area with five properties demolished and four being stabilized
- Working with the Village of Calumet to finalize the Public Green Space Park Project after the winter pause.

DEVELOP & ATTRACT TALENT

- Attended networking meetings with Michigan Works, Remote Workforce Keweenaw, and MTU.
- Hosted six MIOSHA training events with over 90 attendees
- Partnered with the MEDC and Cities of Houghton and Hancock to lead an Emerging Developer Workshop Series.

ENHANCE CULTURAL & RECREATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

- Continued collaboration with KCVB, WUPPDR, and Houghton County Recreation Authority on trails and recreation infrastructure projects.
- Participated in governance and advisory committees for the Keweenaw Heartlands land acquisition.
- Actively supporting stabilization and redevelopment of the Calumet Air Force Station.
- Assisted Chassell Township to advance plans for a multi-use trail along the Chassell to Baraga rail grade.
